UT's interns will assist legislators and tour such government facilities as the State Capitol, the Bicentennial Mall, the Riverbend maximum-security prison, and the Tennessee Supreme Court, while gaining experience through day-to-day legislative duties including bill analyses, constituent work and research. 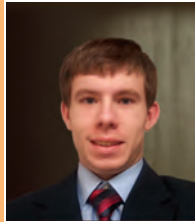

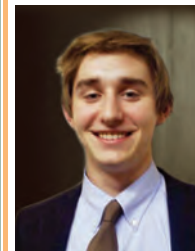
