Academic Common Market (ACM) Program

The campuses of The University of Tennessee participate in the Academic Common Market (ACM), a tuition savings program for eligible college students living in the 16 Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) member states who want to pursue degrees that are not offered by their in-state institutions. Students can enroll in selected academic majors at out-of-state public universities without paying out-of-state tuition.

For more than 50 years, the SREB Academic Common Market has enabled students to pursue out-of-state college majors at discounted tuition rates, through agreements among the states and colleges and universities. Over 1,400 undergraduate and graduate degree programs are available.

To qualify for the ACM, a student must be a resident of an SREB member state, be admitted unconditionally into the institution and program that is approved by the home state, and be certified in the home state to participate. The program must be in the ACM inventory. The ACM program is not competitive or merit-based, but applicants must meet state residency and college program requirements.

The SREB, with the cooperation of 16 southern states, administers the Academic Common Market. The ACM participant states are: Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, and West Virginia.

Some SREB states limit participation to graduate programs or to their currently available program inventory.
